Know the Basics of ITF World Tennis Number

Free, Flexible and Powerful

- The ITF World Tennis Number (WTN)
 was developed by the International Tennis
 Federation (ITF) to provide a global standard
 for players, regardless of age, gender, or ability
- The ITF WTN is FREE for players and connected to a suite of flexible, digital tools for providers to use on Serve Tennis
- The ITF WTN uses a 40-1 scale, beginners start at 40 and professionals will be closer to 1
- This global rating system is updated weekly— The more matches played, the more recently, the more accurate the rating



ITF World Tennis Number For...



Players



- Players can see their ITF World Tennis Number on their usta.com Player Profile
- Players have access to more in-depth ITF WTN data on worldtennisnumber.com, like head-to-head comparisons
- Players get separate, personalized ITF WTNs for singles and doubles
- A player's ITF WTN is **updated weekly** and is **analyzed** on a **set level**
- A player's ITF WTN also includes their GAMEZONe a range of potential opponents
 whose numbers are close to theirs on the scale to keep matches competitive and fun

High School Tennis



- USTA has developed a free High School platform to easily facilitate entering scores
 that count towards ITF WTN. This easy-to-use platform is great for dual matches,
 tournaments, as well as managing schedules and rosters. To learn more, please

- Some high school players may have an individual ITF WTN from sanctioned tournaments or play on usta.com outside of their school team, however, a player's ITF WTN should not impact their ability to participate on a school team

- WTN is the exclusive rating for USTA junior sanctioned tournaments
- · WTN tournaments and WTN Match Play are available free of charge on Serve Tennis
- WTN Tournaments and WTN Match Play allows providers to dictate specific ranges of WTN's (e.g. 35.5 to 33.5) and aged (e.g. 13-17) to promote level based play
