Mixed 40 & Over National Champions!

Congratulations WSC-LAO 9.0 Team

The Mixed 40 and Over 9.0 team from Woodinville Sports Club, captained by Anh Lao, travelled to the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Florida this past November for the Mixed 40 & Over National Championships and brought home a National title to the Pacific Northwest!

The team was primed for Nationals after making it through an extremely challenging Northwest Washington league season undefeated. Team member, Connie Min tells the team's amazing story.

After winning the Mixed 40+ 8.0 National Championship in 2022, captain Anh Lao thought, "Why not do it again for 9.0?" Along with 8.0 teammates Tam Ly, Charles Thompson, and Annie Chechitelli, Lao recruited 4.0's Bally Bang, Dayna Eberhardt, Suzanne Eichenlaub, and Connie Min; 4.5's Denise Zwald, Alex Greninger, Winston McClanahan, Sarah Schodde, and Gina LaPorta; and 5.0's Nick Bass and Josh Basha, to form a deep, powerhouse 9.0 team that went undefeated through Sectionals.

The team suffered its first and only loss of the season in their debut match at Nationals, dropping two courts in super tie-breaks against a tough crew from Southern. The loss was a reality check that luckily came at the beginning of the tournament. Lao described it as a "blessing in disguise because it made us hungrier and more focused." With renewed determination, the team rallied to win their remaining seven matches.

Lao credits the team's success to the dedication of every player to improve their games. In addition to the twice-weekly match play she organized, every teammate played on other gendered teams, set up their own practice matches with other league players, helped each other out with tips, and participated in local tournaments. Many members also benefitted from coaching by Hans Podlipnik, a former ATP doubles specialist.

With so much time spent playing with and against each other, the group quickly bonded, sharing a common goal of putting the needs of the team first. According to Lao, this made the team easy to captain. "Several of us went to cheer on the team even though we knew there was a chance we wouldn't play. Sometimes being a cheerleader is just as important as being the player." Friends and family members from Seattle and Arizona rounded out the cheering squad at every match.

Lao is grateful for the friendships created and the amazing experiences the team had on the road to the National Championship. "Breaking up is the sad part of going to Nationals, but man is it worth it." The team continues to practice together and Lao is already planning for next year. Why not do it again for 10.0?

Tennis On Campus Sectionals

PNW Teams Advance to Nationals

The Tennis On Campus Sectional Championships were held recently in the Portland area, with the top 3 teams advancing to April's TOC National Championships. According to Tournament Director, AnnElise Kahklen, the tennis was incredible again this year.

Tennis on Campus, the collegiate USTA product, held it's annual Sectional Championship at Tualatin Hills Tennis Center in November. There were 30 teams and over 250 college players who came together and competed using the World Team Tennis format. There are nine Universities that have clubs team in the Pacific Northwest, with the top three teams of University of Washington, University of Oregon, and Oregon State University besting the rest of the competition. Those three teams will be advancing to Nationals where they'll represent the PNW in Rome, Georgia this April.

2024 Tournament Calendar & NTRP National Sectional

With the new year comes an opportunity to plan out your 2024 tournament schedule. Have you set your tennis goals yet? Hopefully play more, work less is on your list! To help you plan your 2024 tournament schedule, you can find our updated Master Tournament Calendar <u>HERE</u>.

Are you planning on playing at the 2024 NTRP National Championships? Here is more about the player selection process:

NTRP Nationals Player Selection:

The Pacific Northwest receives two quota spots in every division at NTRP National Championships. One spot is reserved for the automatic qualifier and one spot is for whomever's name is the highest listed on the last-published <u>National Standings List</u> prior to the entry deadline. Therefore, if you meet the NTRP Rating and Tournament Ranking Qualifications listed below you are eligible to register for NTRP National Championships.

NTRP Rating Qualification

- Players must have a valid NTRP (C, A, T, or D) at the time of entries closing.
 Players with a valid Mixed Exclusive (M) rating may use this rating for Mixed Doubles only. Players with a Self (S) rating will not be accepted. If a player with a T or M rating is required to Self Rate to play in USTA League, these players may still register if their T or M rating was valid when they self-rated.
- Players may only participate at their current level as of the entry close date.

Tournament Ranking Qualification

- 18+ Players must be on the National Standings List for the division they are registering for in order to be selected.
- 40+/55+ Players must be on the National Standings List for the division they are registering for in order to be selected. If no tournament is offered at the respective 40+/55+ division and no registered players are listed on the respective ranking list, a section may apply for a waiver. The player, at a minimum, must be on the 18+ list for the 40+/55+ division they are applying for.

Remember that REGISTRATION DOES NOT GUARANTEE SELECTION for players who are not selected by automatically qualifying. All players must register on-time in order to avoid being placed on the alternate list.
